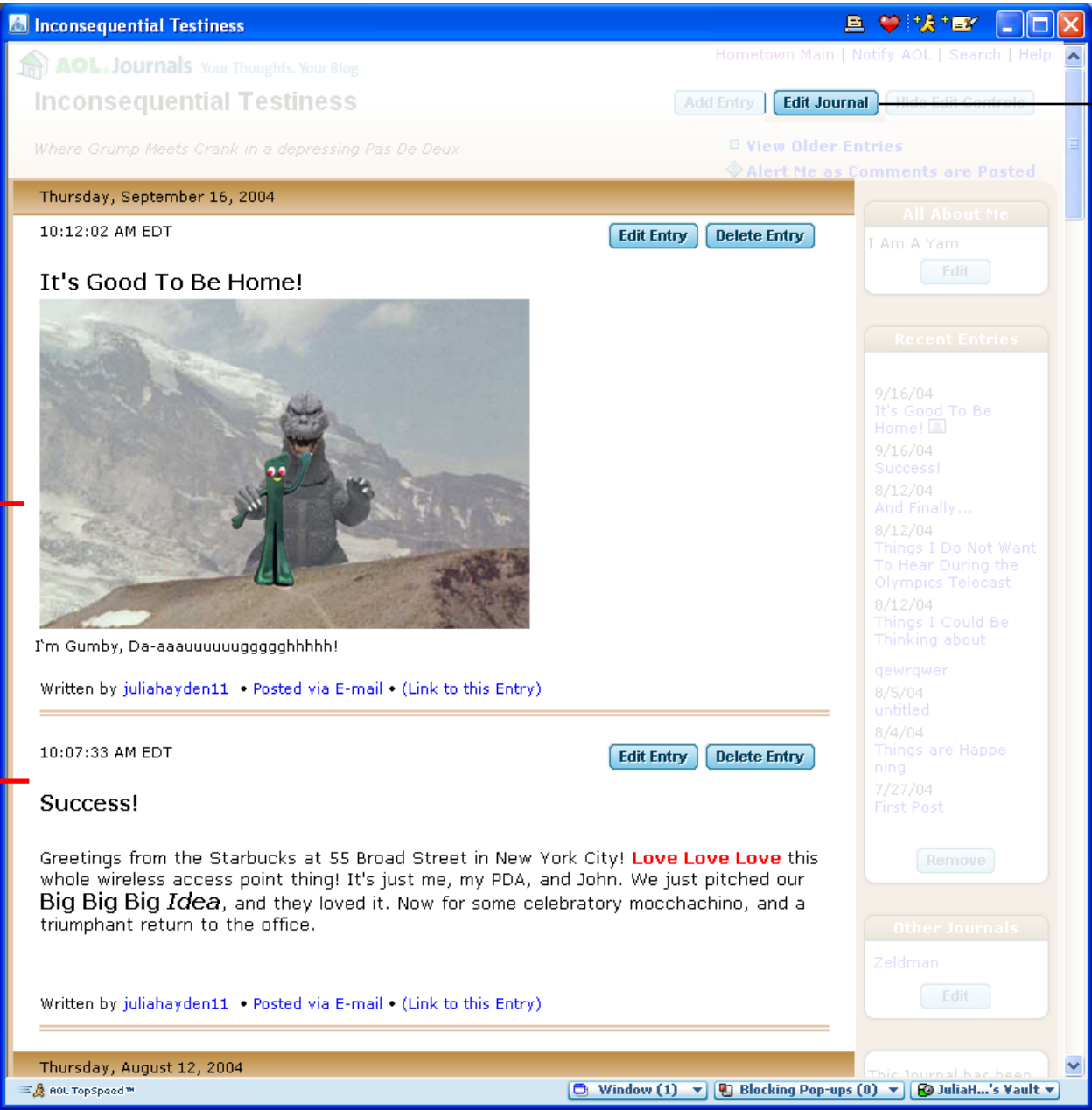

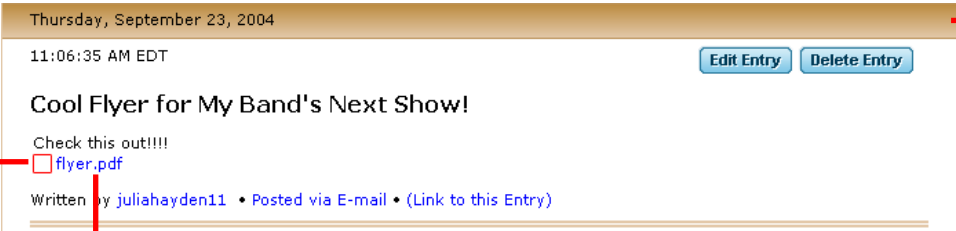

01 - Journal Owner’s Journal, displaying entries posted via E-mail Journaling

01b - Journal Entry with attached file, posted via E-mail Journaling



Only the file name and extension (as specified in the email message) will be displayed.

Attachment Icon

Journal Entries posted from a mobile device or e-mail terminal:

- The Journal Subject lines will be extracted from the subject of the (e-mail) message sent to Journal’s e-mail address.
- Images will not be resized or displayed as a YGP album; each image will appear on its own line.
- The text will be scanned, and malformed and non-standard HTML will be stripped out.
- Non-graphic files that have been attached to an e-mail will be displayed as a hyperlink to the stored files.
- The order of elements in an e-mailed Journal entry: Subject Line, Pictures, Text, Other Attachments, Footer/Meta Information
- “Posted via E-mail” hyperlink opens an informational/promotional message

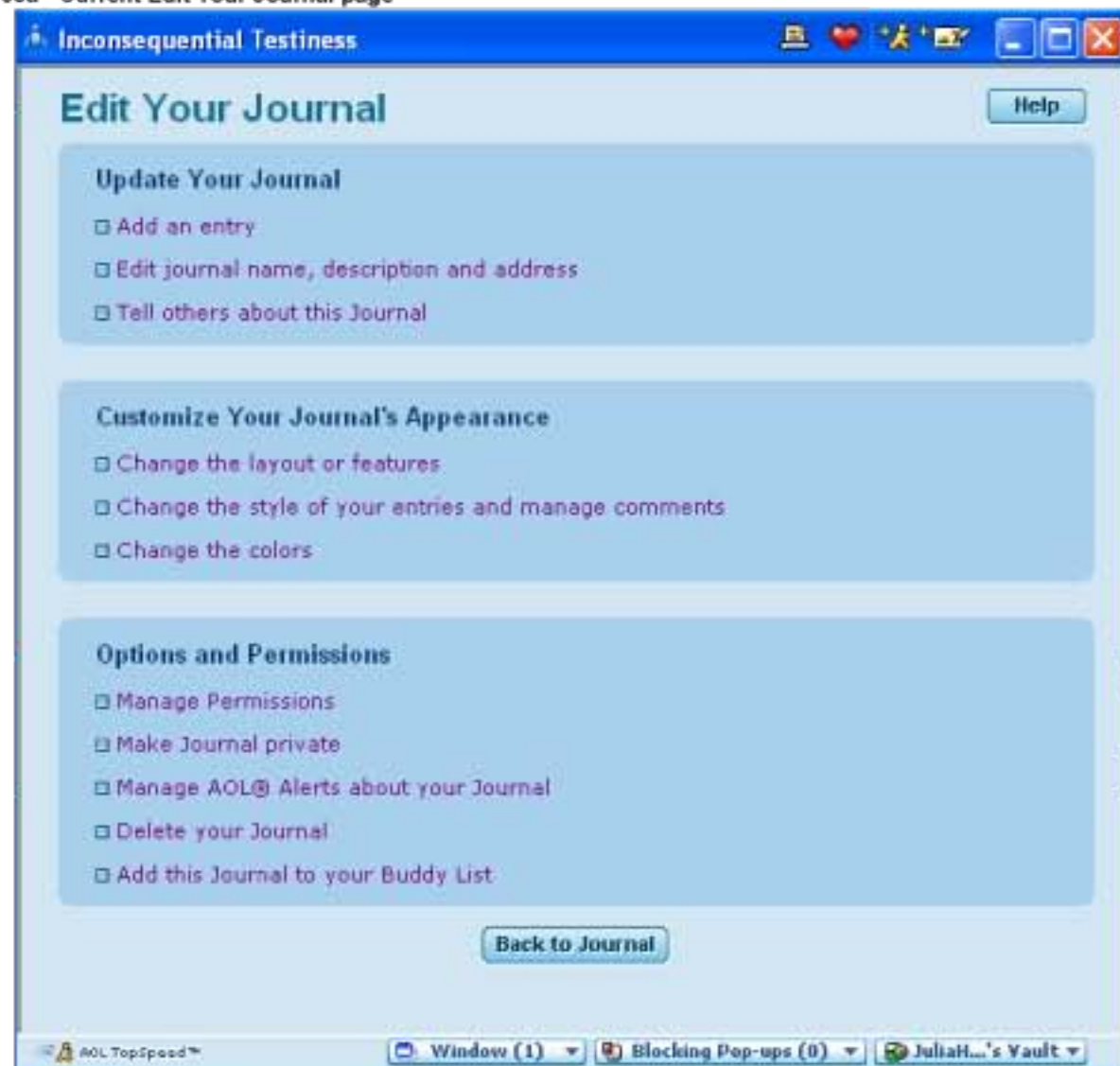

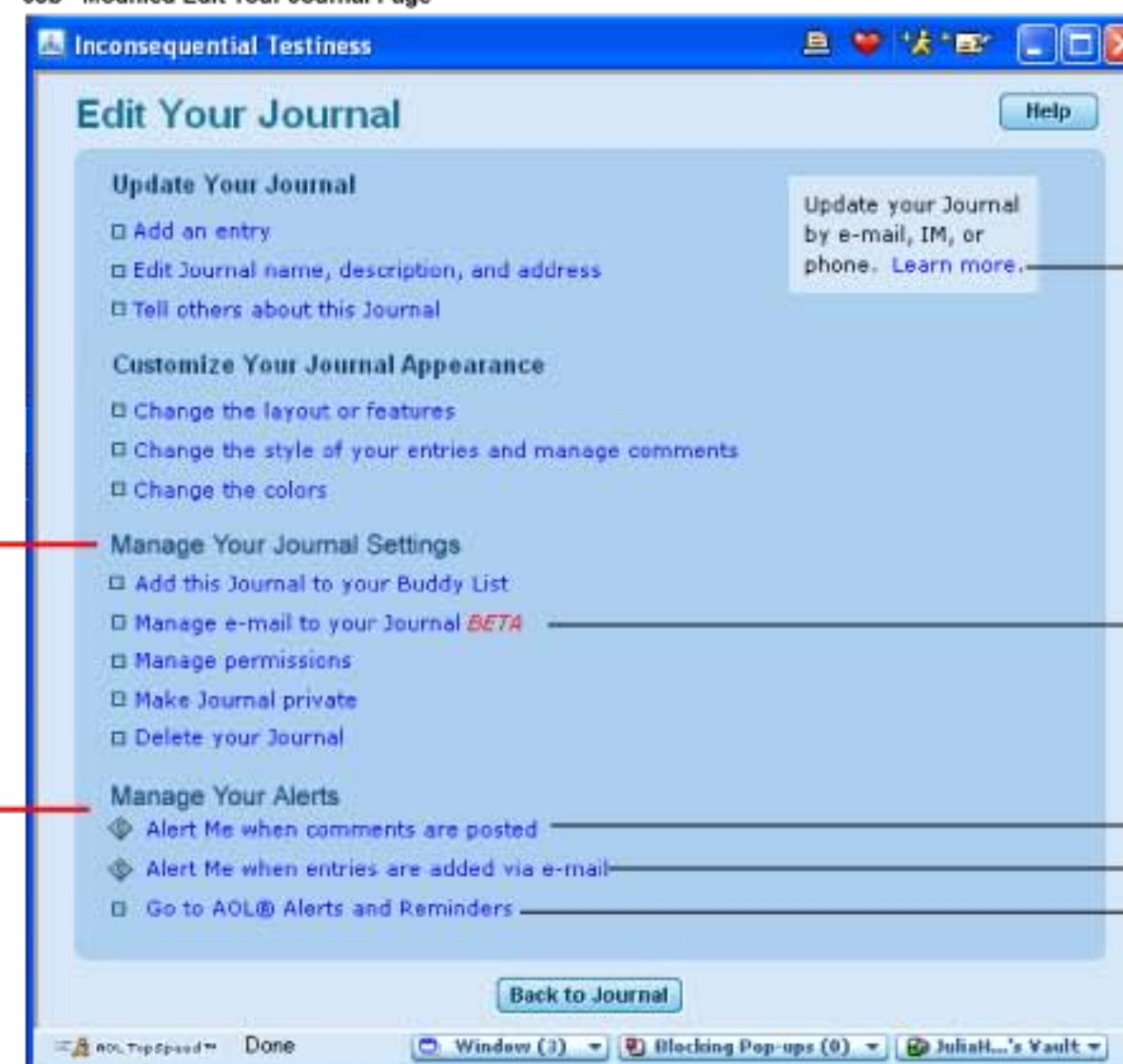

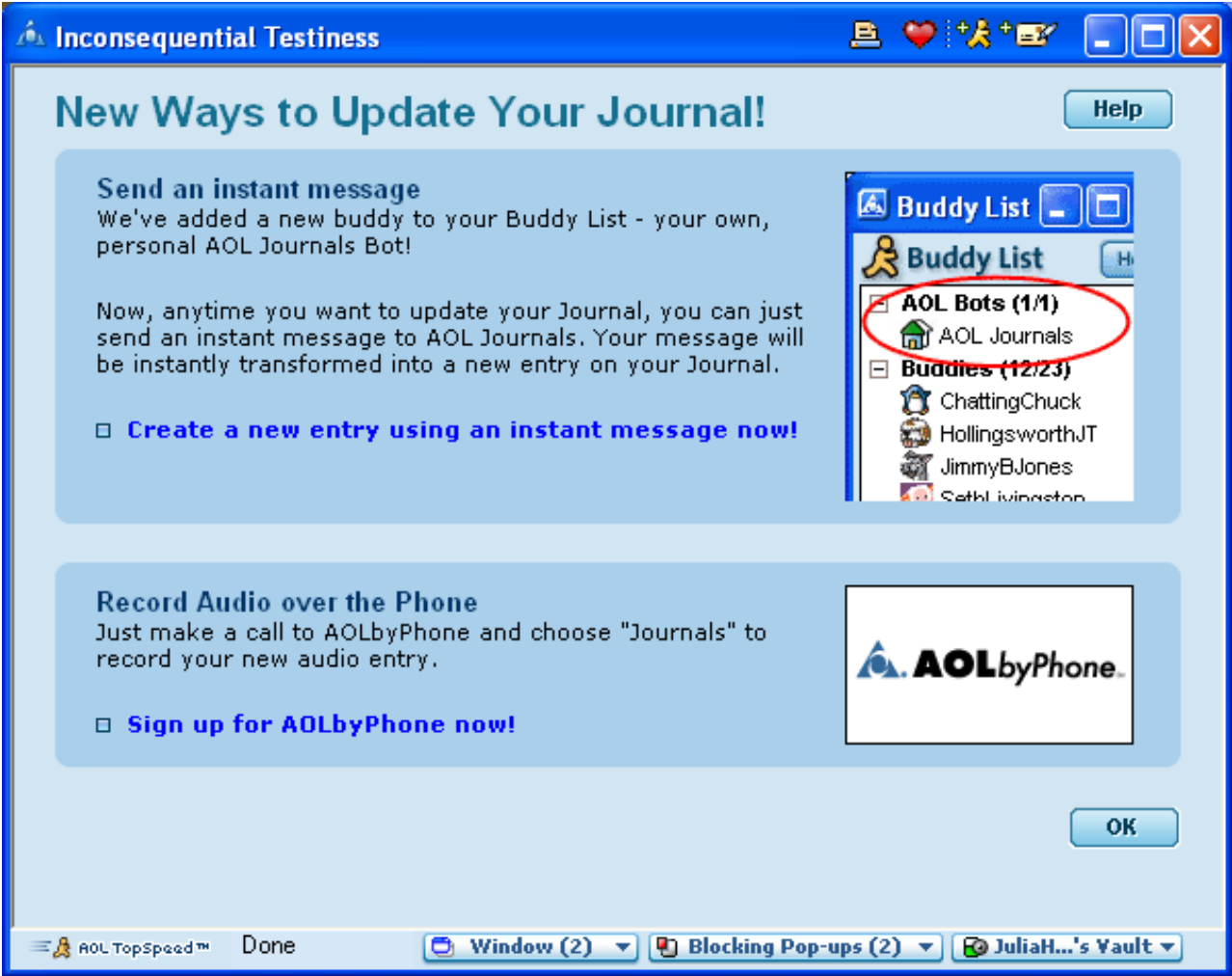
□ New Alerts Section

- The "Alert Me as comments are posted" link duplicates functionality already existing on the front page.
- The "Alert Me as entries are added via e-mail" link is new functionality; this meets the requirement that concerned Journal owners can set up alerts to help Journal Owners know when spammers and other nefarious users post messages to the Journal via E-Mail.
- "Go to AOL® Alerts" is the "Manage AOL® Alerts for your Journal", renamed

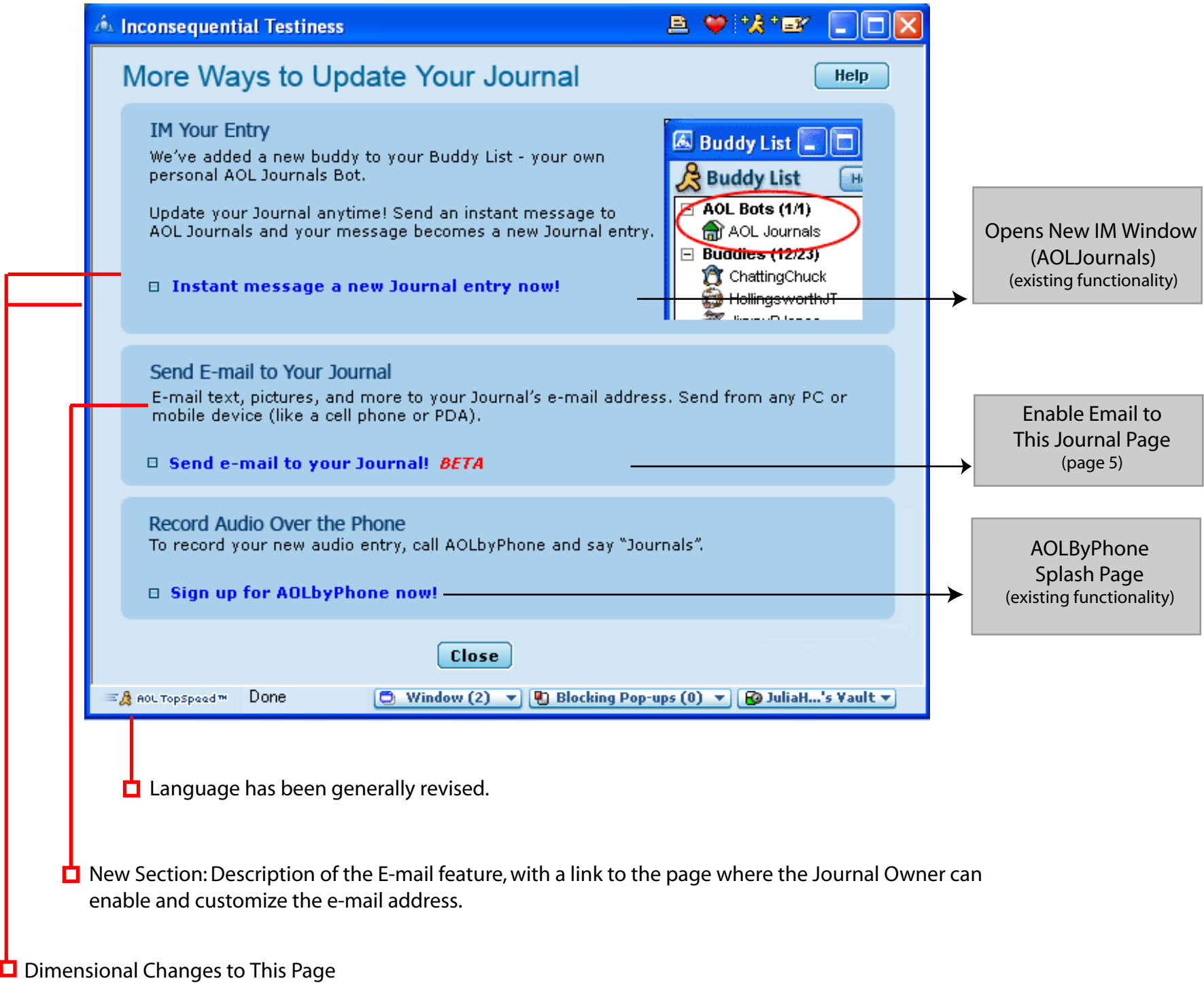
□ Manage Your Journal Settings Section

04a - Current New Ways to Update Your Journal page




04b - Modified New Ways to Update Your Journal Page

How It Works
Your Journal has its own private e-mail address. After you enable your Journal's e-mail address, any message sent to it is automatically posted to your Journal.



05b When Enable E-mail Journaling is not checked, the content of the lower box is different:



Each time you modify your e-mail settings, click **Save** to accept your changes.

☐ **Allow me to add entries via e-mail**

You have chosen to turn e-mail off.

Any new messages sent to this Journal's e-mail address will not be posted to your Journal.

Users can turn the ability to add entries via email on or off. It is off by default.

When the checkbox for this feature is checked, the box beneath the Enable E-mail Journaling label will display the E-mail Journal email address and settings (Figure 04a)

When the checkbox for this feature is not checked, the box beneath the Enable E-mail Journaling will display text that further describes that choice (Figure 04b)

Users can generate a new (random) ID Number by clicking the Give Me a New E-mail Address button. When the user clicks the button, the journal address displayed above the button is updated with the new random number.
